What about the Cursillo Weekend?

Cursillo is a Spanish word. It simply means ‘a short course’, with the idea of a ‘short race’ – something that takes you forward quickly. The term “short course” refers particularly to the three-day weekends which are the way you join the Cursillo movement.

The weekend provides:

- An experience of living in a Christian Community — supported by prayer.
- Talks and Discussions, worship services and times of reflection.
- Small groups working, praying, singing, laughing and growing together.
- Separate weekends for women and men.

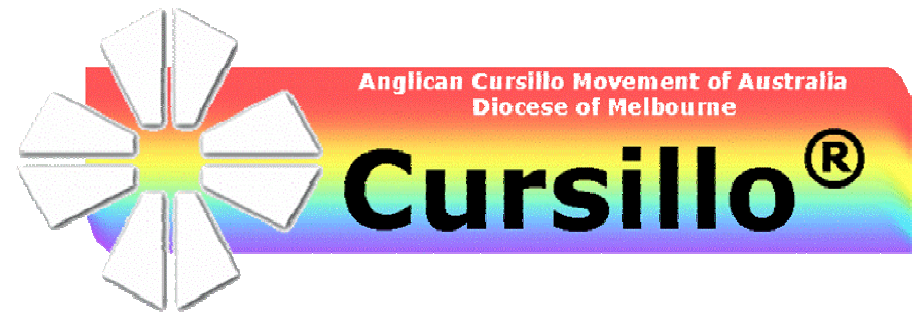

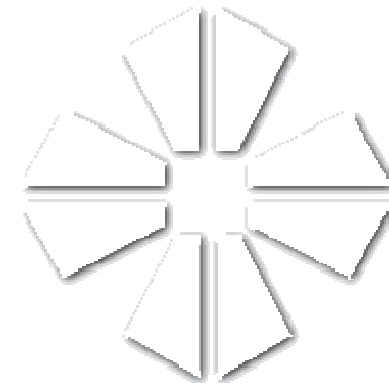

What is Cursillo?

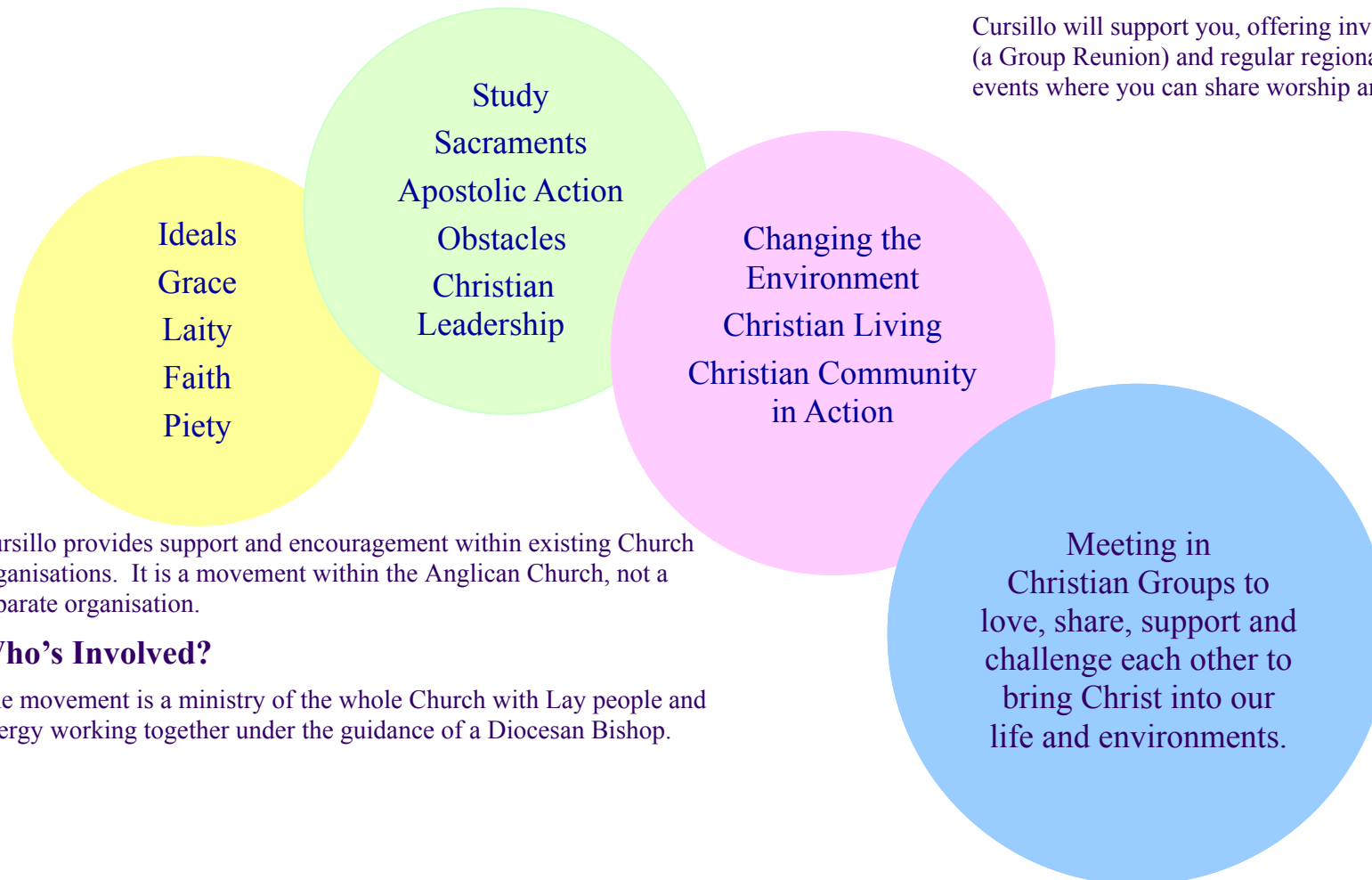


The purpose of Melbourne Anglican Cursillo is to nourish and equip people so that they may embrace and enjoy the fullness of Christian Life.

What is Cursillo®?

Cursillo is a worldwide movement within many of the Christian churches. It started in Spain in the 1940's, reached Australia in 1979 and is now in all but four of the Australian Anglican dioceses.

Cursillo is a method that helps us consciously live in God's grace, to bring into our daily life the feeling of community we can share as Christians, to nourish and equip us so that we may embrace and enjoy the fullness of Christian life.



Cursillo provides support and encouragement within existing Church organisations. It is a movement within the Anglican Church, not a separate organisation.

Who's Involved?

The movement is a ministry of the whole Church with Lay people and Clergy working together under the guidance of a Diocesan Bishop.

What does Cursillo do?

Cursillo empowers you to develop and enrich your Christian experience and to discover what it means to you to be a Christian.

Cursillo is not necessarily about “doing more Christian things” – it is about “being more Christian” than we were before, about moving forward with God, in the way God wants to take us.

You may want to become more involved in parish life or diocesan activities, or you may do the same things you did before but with more enthusiasm.

Cursillo will support you, offering involvement in a small group (a Group Reunion) and regular regional and diocesan gatherings and events where you can share worship and fellowship with other Christians.
